Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord

The Lectionary for Mass

First Reading: As we read from the beginning of the Acts of the Apostles, we hear what took place after the Resurrection: Jesus appeared to the disciples, instructed them through the Holy Spirit, and spoke to them about the kingdom of God. It seems some still held misguided notions about that kingdom, based on the question posed about restoring the kingdom to Israel. It is not for disciples to know the times and seasons, but rather to witness to Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Responsorial Psalm 47: This enthronement psalm originally a song of praise as the ark of the covenant was processed into the Temple, will be heard in our proclamation as a canticle of praise for Christ who ascended into heaven. Christ is our king, who reigns over the nations and will return in the same way as he was seen going into heaven. Therefore we cry out with shouts of joy and gladness.

Second Reading: This two-part reading begins with a prayer for a spirit of wisdom and revelation resulting in knowledge of the hope that belongs to believers. The prayer is followed by a statement of faith: Christ has been raised from the dead and sits above all who have earthly power, with all things under his feet. He is the head of the Church which is his body, and is "the fullness of the one who fills all things in every way."

Gospel: At the end of Matthew's account of the Gospel, Jesus comes to the mountain in Galilee where he has told the disciples to meet him. Note that the audience of primarily Jewish Christians whom the Gospel writer addressed would likely have needed encouragement to share the Gospel with all the nations (not only Jews). The baptismal formula, familiar to the original audience, is familiar to us as well. The Gospel ends with the assurance of Christ's enduring presence.
